

### **GREAT STRIDES TOGETHER**

A Message from the Rector, Fr. Mike Michie



This will be a busy – and important – beginning of the year for us in 2025. Right at the top of our list will be our efforts to replace our roofs over the sanctuary and the two wings beside it and retiring

our debt on the Woehler Family Center (WFC). Especially in April and May, you'll be hearing more about this and will be invited to make a three-year pledge to help us with these efforts.

Incorporating the debt service on the WFC into our operating budget long-term puts some serious constraints on us. Right at \$100,000, this debt service makes us reliant on the rental income we receive from renting it and other spaces on campus. Paying off the WFC debt would be a double blessing, in that we'd be relieved of the \$100,000 and then able to keep the rental income for staffing, program, and outreach, around \$75,000.

We are asking for a three-year pledge so that we can, ideally, have the debt retired completely before our balloon payment hits and we'd have to restructure the remaining loan balance in 2029. The WFC debt, \$1.3 million and the roof replacements, current estimates are about \$450,000, add up to \$1.75 million. I feel good about our ability to accomplish this if we work together. Please be praying about this effort, for our leadership team, and for St. Thomas.

You will notice that we are not including the organ replacement project at this time. This is due to the feedback that we got from our feasibility study and the input we received from members of the congregation. As it ages, like the roof, our organ will need replacing one day. But I am grateful for your honesty and want to let you know that we heard you! Should you want to give toward the organ project, that restricted fund remains in place, ready for your donation.

Take a good look at this edition of The Clarion to see the great things we have planned for 2025. I'm particularly excited about the teaching that Rev. Allie and I will be doing at Discipleship Hour. I'm already looking forward to our Lenten Series on the Wednesday evenings of Lent. Called "The Blessing of Eucharist", we are going to take the Eucharistic service we use each Sunday and teach you through it. We'll pay particular attention to the Eucharistic Prayers, which are beautiful retellings of Christ's sacrifice on the cross.

After attending these classes, we pray that you'll have a deeper and more profound understanding of the worship service so that your experience at church will be deepened and blessed. What's more, I'd like to see you be able to navigate the service with just your Prayer Book and Hymnal. You can do it!

As always, I want you to know how grateful I am to our church and school staff for their good work. We are here to serve the Lord, our church, and you. We'll be working particularly hard in early 2025 in upgrading our church and financial systems. This database will make our communication with you and information sharing (things like calendars, directories, and your financial statements) easier and more accessible. We are blessed to have these good people working here. Join me in thanking our staff for their work when you get a chance!

Finally, thank you! Thank you for your attendance, generosity, prayers, and love for St. Thomas. We have made, are making, and will make great strides together. Let me know how I can pray for and support you this year. And remember, God loves you!

A Message from the Vice Rector, Rev. Allie Melancon



For the last year as I've made my morning walks along the Hays Street Bridge, I watched the progress of the city transform an empty lot into a skatepark. Mornings were met with the workers laying rebar and setting the

frames and then the cement trucks and the landscapers came. It has been remarkable to watch the park come alive from the vantage point of the bridge.

Recently, the city opened the skatepark, and I found myself observing the skaters from the bridge. So, the other week after dinner I suggested that we take a walk to the skatepark to check it out; I hoped there would be more folks out and about at that hour. I was right, as we made our way with some small humans in tow, (it's never too soon to introduce them to new sports and hobbies) we found our way into the skatepark.

I soon realized I wasn't sure about the etiquette: could we walk on the sidewalk people were skating on? Could we stand around and watch without any intention or equipment to participate? Not to mention none of us possessing the ability to skateboard. I felt out of place and hoped that our presence wasn't going to offended anyone. The small humans quickly took an interest at the skaters and the smallest human found an abandoned skateboard with kittens and rainbows on it.

Just as soon as we arrived and felt out of place, we found our footing, as if we had been invited and belonged all along. We were all mesmerized by the skatepark and the people skating and the atmosphere and energy in the air. As we walked home at dusk, I couldn't help but wonder about how easy it would have been for me to keep observing the skatepark from the bridge, from the vantage point of an observer. There are lots of opportunities to be the hands of Jesus at St. Thomas. West Avenue volunteers bag groceries on Tuesday mornings to distribute to 400 families in need. You just need to show up around 9am. They also have a clothing pantry if you have gently used clothing to donate.

Christian Assistance Ministries (CAM) always needs volunteers to make sandwiches and lunch bags, help with sorting clothing, and accepting donations.

Magdalena House needs help on Tuesday evenings playing with children while the Moms are in classes. We are talking with them to see what other needs St. Thomas might fill, such as organizing a meal.

NESA (North East Senior Assistance) can always use more drivers to take clients to doctor visits or grocery shopping. And they also need some "handy-man" volunteers.

The Grocery Gang can use some more guys with pickups to deliver from the Food Bank to Santa Fe Episcopal Church Food Pantry. Deliveries are Compassion has a Food Pantry where generally on the second and fourth Fridays, meeting at the Food Bank at 8am. We are usually finished by 9am.


> Our Haven for Hope volunteers help prepare and serve dinner on the second Monday of the month. If enough people are interested, we could have another time slot.

Hello, 2025! We are excited to reflect on the outstanding achievements of our preschool in 2024 and kick off the enrollment process for the 2025-2026 school year and Summer 2025! We take pride in showcasing our campus to

prospective families, offering them an insightful glimpse into the vibrant life of our school. This is a wonderful time to celebrate what makes St. Thomas Episcopal School the premier choice for early education. Our hallways are filled with winter exploration, laughter, and smiles as dedicated adults and enthusiastic young learners engage in enriching daily experiences.

At St. Thomas Episcopal School (STES), we maintain low student-to-teacher ratios for all age groups. Smaller class sizes facilitate both smallgroup and larger-group peer learning, allowing for choice time and individualized opportunities for discovery. Each classroom engages in a blend of open-ended and structured play, creative activities using various art mediums, and outdoor experiences in our playground, garden, and courtyard.

Our goal at STES is to support the holistic development of each child while they are on our campus, preparing them for the larger world outside. The relationships formed with teachers and peers enhance and challenge the children's natural curiosity. Our educators respect and value every child, nurturing their physical, intellectual, emotional, and social growth.

One of the most powerful aspects of a churchbased Reggio Emilia preschool is the strong sense of community we cultivate. Parents, teachers, and church members work together to create a supportive and inclusive environment where each child is valued and encouraged. This community aspect aligns with the Reggio Emilia philosophy, which emphasizes the importance of relationships and collaboration in the learning process.

In a world where early childhood education is crucial for a child's overall development, church-based, Reggio Emilia-inspired preschools stand out as a beautiful blend of innovative pedagogy and faithbased nurturing. They offer children the opportunity to grow not only in knowledge but also in their understanding of themselves, others, and the world around them.

#### Have You Heard of Our STES Annual Tiger Fund and Why We Ask You to Contribute?

Tuition alone does not cover the full cost of educating a St. Thomas student. Like most independent schools, STES does not receive ongoing state or federal funds, and we rely on a tradition of annual giving to help offset operational expenses. The unrestricted funds generated by the Tiger Fund make STES special and directly support this year's students and staff. Key areas these funds support include:

- Maintaining low teacher-to-student ratios, with one teacher for every five or six students, depending on age.
- Retaining our caring and highly qualified staff, which includes four certified teachers and ten staff members with over ten years of early childhood experience.

- Ensuring our teachers stay current with research-based curriculum and best practices through continuing education.
- Providing classroom resources such as books, manipulatives, art supplies, hands-on experiences, playground equipment, and more.

The current amount raised/pledged through May 2025 is \$22,500 of our initial \$25,000 goal to balance our annual budget. STES Dream Goal is \$50,000 to honor our first 50 years and secure our next 50 years!!
